NORTHUMBERLAND FUNDING EVENT MARCH 30th 2011

Having traditionally arranged events, for a number of years, at which voluntary and community organisations and groups could meet charitable trusts and other funders face-to-face, CVA Blyth Valley; Community Action Northumberland; and Wansbeck CVS held their first joint county-wide initiative on March 30th 2011 at Choppington Social Welfare Centre. This event was part of a wider CVABV/CAN/WCVS/ joint effort to provide a coordinated pattern of support to voluntary organisations across Northumberland.

The event was widely publicised across the sector and invitations were sent out directly to the user groups of each organisation. Attendance was by booking only.

Individual one-to-one sessions with funders were arranged in 15 minute appointments between 11am and 1pm and then from 2pm to 4pm.

It was originally intended to hold a 5-7pm session but the take-up for this was very low and so the late session was cancelled.

The event proved extremely popular and bookings for both the face-to-face funders' sessions and the workshops were over-subscribed and the strict booking deadline had to be imposed.

(A) FUNDERS:

- ▶ Northumberland Uplands Leader (NuLAG) were also invited to the event but only received 2 appointments and as both of these were outside the eligibility area these appointments were cancelled and the funder was advised to withdraw.
- ▶ The invitation to BBC Children In Need was held up in their 'internal' postal system and consequently their acceptance was not received until all the invitations had been sent out. Fortunately the funder agreed to attend and run an 'open desk'.
- ▶ Unity Bank had also accepted an invitation to the event but had to withdraw.

All 20 funders returned their Evaluation Forms - a 100% response rate.

Summary results from the funders show:-

- ▶ 95% found attending the event either 'very worthwhile' or 'worthwhile'
- ▶ 20% of projects met 'all' of the individual funders' criteria; 55% met 'most' of these and 20% met about 'half' of the funders' criteria
- ▶ 90% of funders felt that a 15 minute appointment time was 'enough' time; whilst only 10% thought it was 'too much time'
- ▶ 50% rated the information that was sent out to funders about and prior to the event as 'excellent' and 40% felt it was 'good'
- ▶ 65% rated the venue as 'excellent' and 35% as 'good'
- ▶ 45% rated the refreshments and lunch buffet as 'excellent' and 50% rated this 'good'

(B) GROUPS:

A total of 84 groups attended the event.

Groups were sent a Project Summary Form on which to describe their project in order to make the most of the 15 minute appointment time and reduce the necessity to repeat the project details to each and every funder.

A total of 52 evaluation forms were received - a response rate of almost 62%.

Geographical analysis of the areas from which the groups attending are based shows:-
(where groups provide a supra-district service they have been assessed according to their main office/base)

CVA BLYTH VALLEY	25 groups	29.8%
CAN	26 groups	31.0 %
WANSBECK CVS	33 groups	39.3%

Summarised group results show:-

- ▶ 96% of groups found the event either 'very useful' or 'useful'
- ▶ 85% rated the opportunity to meet funders in person to discuss projects 'very useful'
- ▶ 67% of groups found the project summary form either 'very useful' or 'useful' in making the best use of their 15 minute appointments with funders
- ▶ Over 92% found the event was either 'very useful' or 'useful' in increasing their knowledge of potential funding opportunities
- ▶ Over 92% stated that they intended to make a funding application to one or more of the funders at the event
- ▶ 71% of groups rated the organisation of the event as 'excellent'
- ▶ Almost 79% rated the venue as 'excellent'

▶ Over 65% rated the refreshments and lunch buffet as 'excellent' and 27% as 'good'

(C) MARKET PLACE:

(D) WORKSHOPS:

Two training workshops were held:-

- ▶ '*What Makes a Good Funding Application*' - by the Community Foundation was run twice (due to popular demand) from 11am to 12 and then again from 1pm to 2pm.
- ▶ '*Outcomes*' - held by the Big Lottery ran from 2pm to 4pm.

16 groups attended the Big Lottery workshop, and
32 groups attended the Community Foundation workshops.

Only 19 of the groups completed the section on workshop evaluation - but 4 of these attended both.

- ▶ 47% found the information that they acquired from the workshops 'very useful';
- ▶ 42% found the information 'useful' and
- ▶ 10% 'useful in part'

(E) EXPENDITURE:

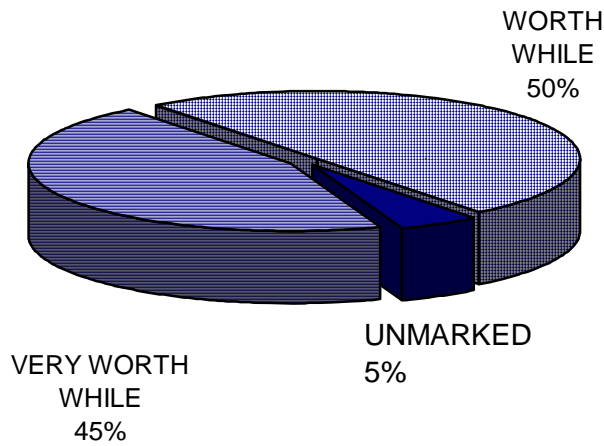
It was agreed at the outset of the planning for the event that, in order to attract the maximum number of groups for this - the first joint county-wide event, a lunch buffet, as well as the usual teas, coffees and biscuits, would be provided. This was also deemed appropriate for the comfort of the funders attending the day-long event.

The cost of the event was £1016.67 plus £183.33 VAT - total £1200. The cost was split equally between the 3 organisations.

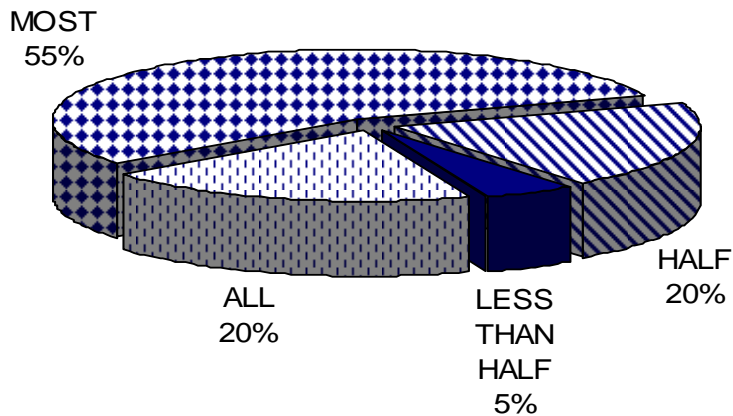
This figure obviously does not include staff time, staff travel, printing, photocopying, office stationery, postage etc.

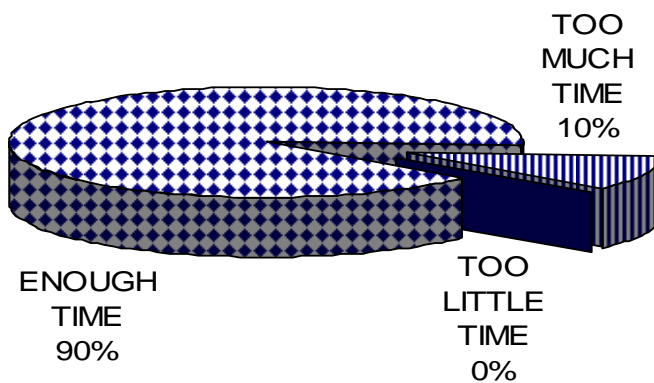
HOW VALUABLE WAS THE EVENT TO YOUR FUNDING ORGANISATION



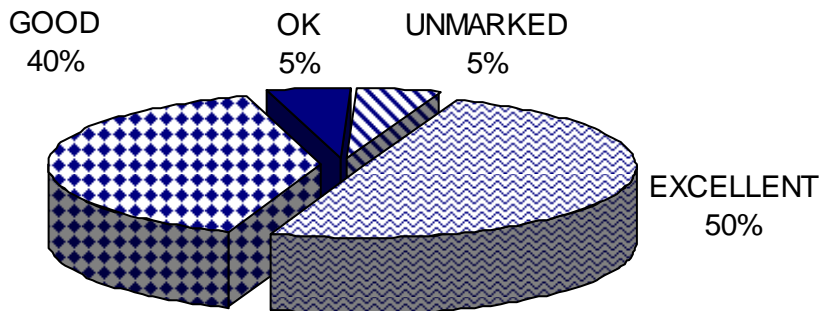
HOW MANY OF YOUR APPOINTMENTS WERE FOR PROJECTS WHICH MEET YOUR FUNDING CRITERIA



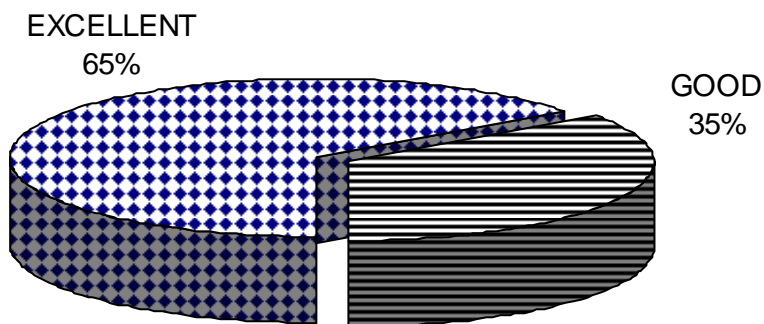
DO YOU FEEL THAT 15 MINUTE APPOINTMENTS WAS SUFFICIENT TIME TO DISCUSS PROJECTS



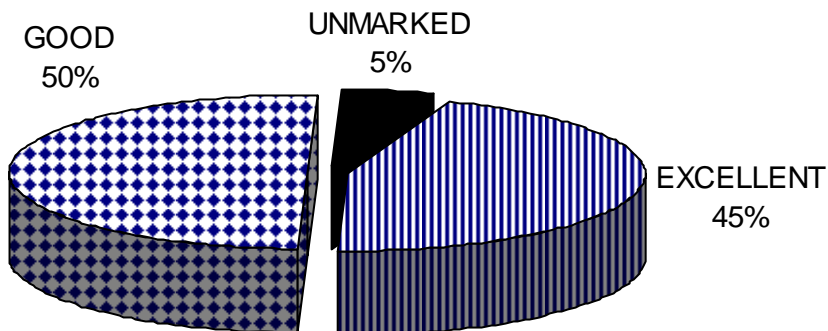
HOW WOULD YOU RATE THE INFORMATION THAT YOU RECEIVED PRIOR TO THE EVENT



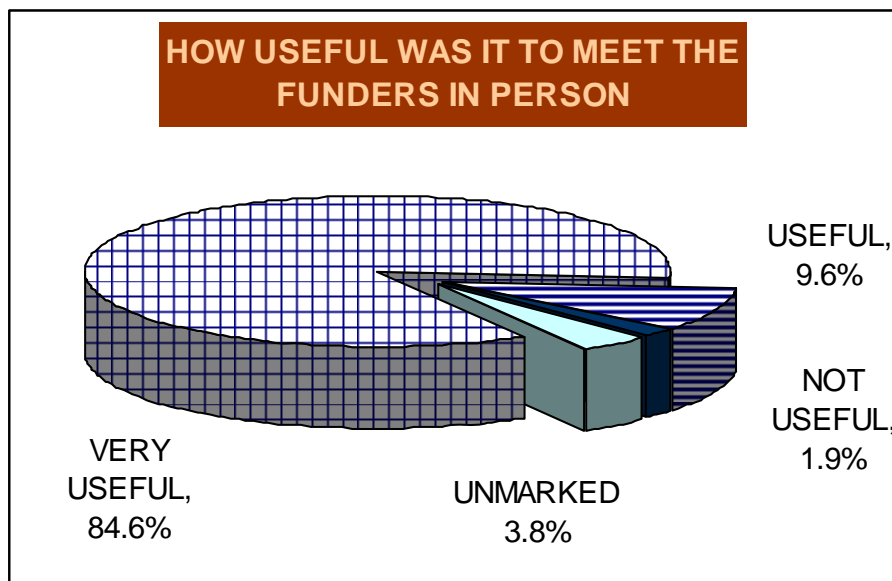
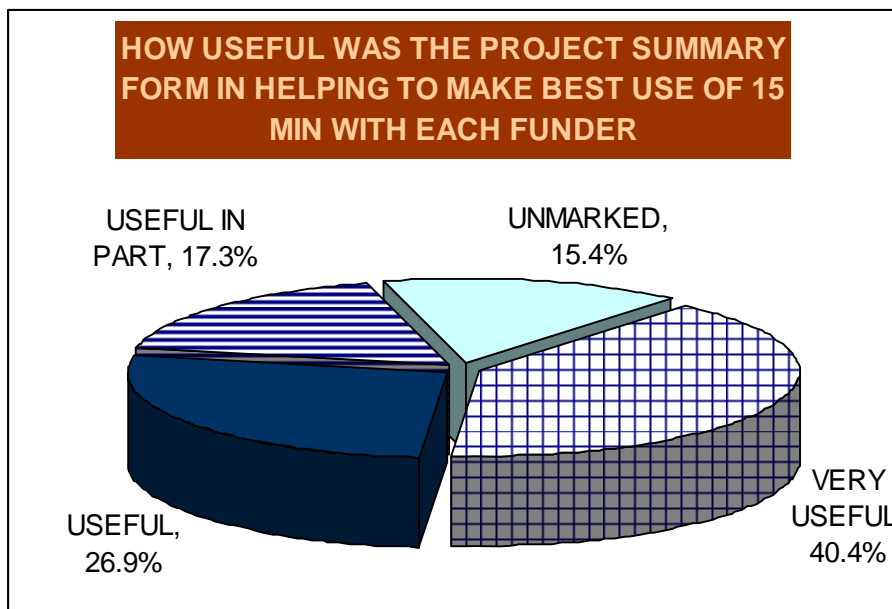
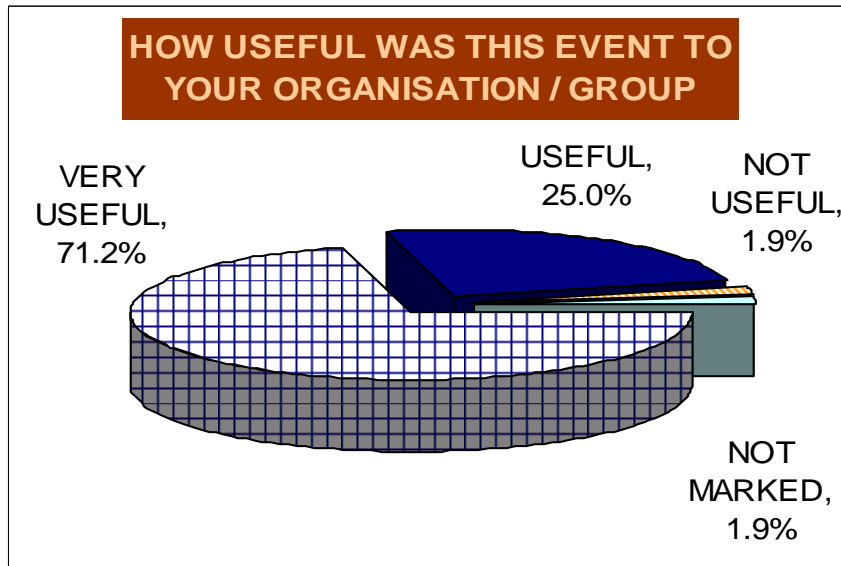
HOW WOULD YOU RATE THE VENUE



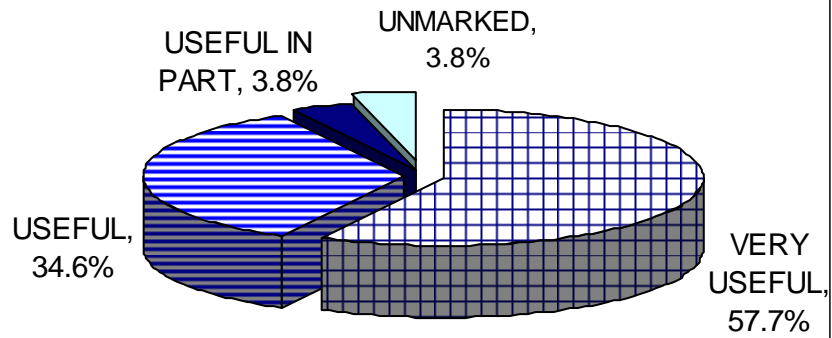
HOW WOULD YOU RATE THE REFRESHMENTS AND THE BUFFET



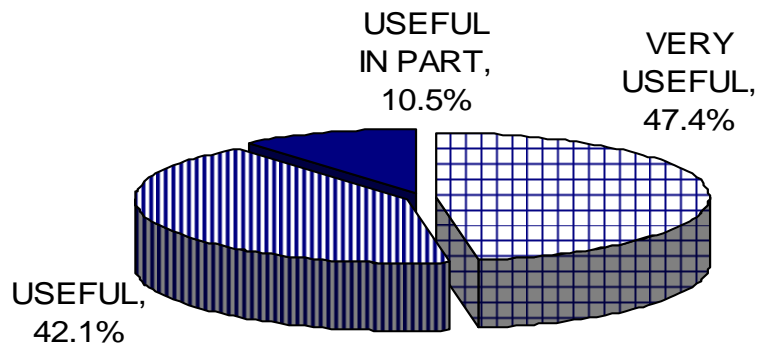

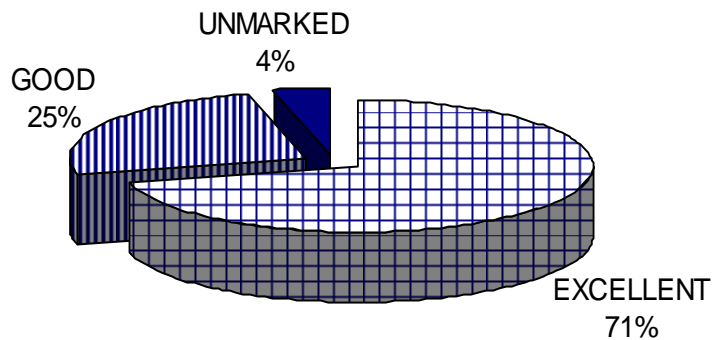

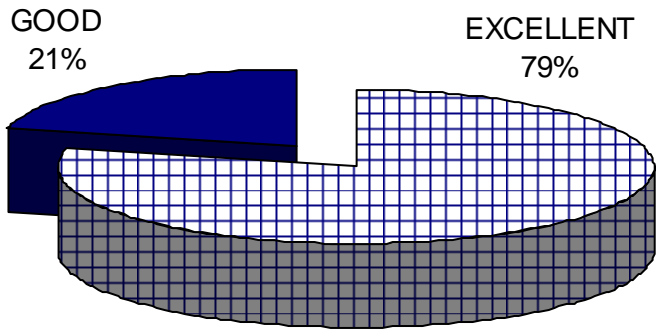
HOW USEFUL WAS THE INFORMATION GIVEN OUT AT THE WORKSHOPS



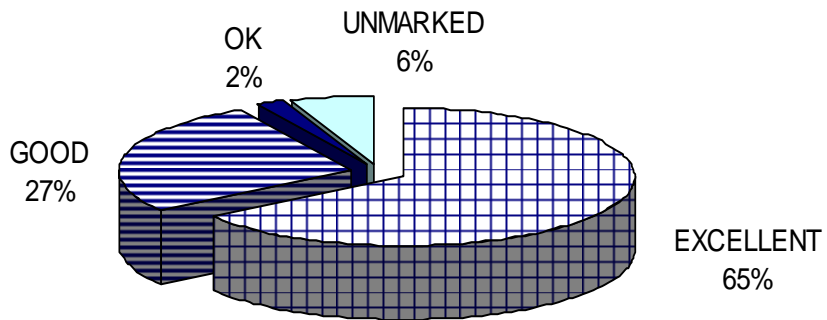
HOW WELL DO YOU FEEL THE EVENT WAS ORGANISED



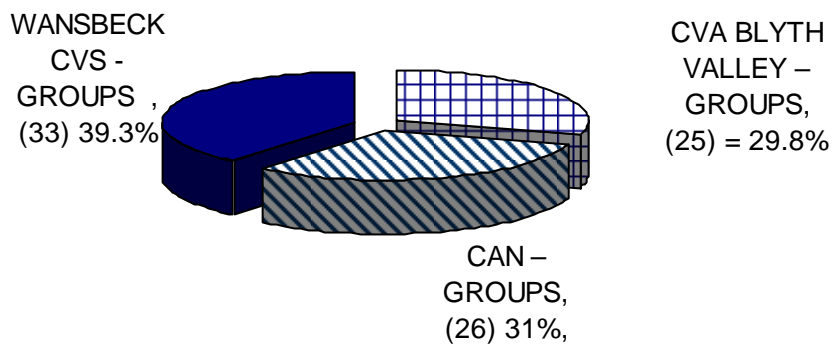
HOW WOULD YOU RATE THE VENUE
